WINDOW CLEANING

WATERFED POLE CLEANING MADE EASY

There are three simple stages to cleaning windows with a water fed pole. If you follow these three steps methodically every time, you will find it is far more efficient and effective than using the traditional ladder and squeegee.

On first cleans where the windows are particularly dirty you will need to be careful and take your time.

- 1.** Scrub the top frame, then the side frames and then the sill thoroughly. On first cleans in particular, it is a good idea to concentrate your scrubbing on the top frame first. This is because a lot of dirt will often be located there, and after you think you've cleaned a window, dirt from the top frame will drip down onto your clean window making it dirty again. On first cleans, it is a good idea to go give all the frames a good scrub and rinse first before tackling the glass.
- 2.** Scrub the glass, being careful to make sure you don't miss any of it. The best way is to work up and down starting at the left and working across the window to the right.
- 3.** For stubborn stains like dried-on bird muck, snail trails etc. you might want to give it a good soak and scrub first, leave it for five minutes, then come back to it to give it another go.

Rinse window thoroughly, starting from the top frame, going from side to side all the way down to the sill. Rinsing is very important so make sure you do it very thoroughly.
